



Massachusetts Ten Most Endangered Historic Resources

Since 1993, Preservation Massachusetts has sought to spotlight imperiled buildings, landscapes and resources across the Commonwealth through the Ten Most Endangered list, an important advocacy and education program. The list is one of the first steps in focusing statewide attention on the condition of these historic resources and their importance to communities, and often serves as a catalyst for extensive preservation opportunities. Nominated resources are reviewed and selected by a volunteer committee overseen by Preservation Massachusetts. To nominate a resource you are concerned about, please follow the directions below.

Ten Most Endangered Nomination Form

Description of the Endangered Resource: Briefly describe the resource's main features and current setting; do key features retain original character, how has the setting changed or resource been moved, is there evidence of previous architectural or landscape designs or features?

Historical Significance: State the resource's historical, architectural, cultural and community relevance. Please note if the resource is:

- *listed on the State Register of Historic Places
- *eligible/listed on the National Register of Historic Places
- *a designated landscape or archeological site
- *located within a local or National Register historic district
- *a Massachusetts or National Historic Landmark

Please include any available Massachusetts Historical Commission Inventory/Survey forms and National Register, Heritage Landscape or other historic documentation (if applicable).

Threat: Describe the nature of the threat (demolition, arson, vandalism, foreclosure, development, insensitive public policy, inappropriate rehabilitation, neglect). Please be specific and quantify the immediacy of the threat within a time line of three, six, and twelve months.

Community Commitment: Detail any local support for the preservation of the resource and the to what extent the broader community is aware of the threats. Please include positions from local historical commissions, town managers, select boards or mayors.

Future Plans: Describe feasible future plans for the resource and how listing as a Ten Endangered will aid the resource. How would the listing be used by the nominator/community to positively encourage the resource's preservation or reuse?

Additional Information: Please include: at least 5-10 hi-res color images, digital preferred that show the resource and context. (*provide photographer name for credit*) a map of the resources location, additional letters of support, correspondence, newspaper articles, editorials or additional comments may be submitted.
